Remembering the steps of SAFE can help you in a sexual assault or sexual violence emergency.



Safety — Are you in a safe place? This should be somewhere that the perpetrator of the sexual violence cannot access you and where there are safe and trustworthy people to support you.

Assistance — Do you need medical attention? This may be important if you have any injuries. It can also help avoid sexually transmitted infections or pregnancy. A Sexual Assault Care Center can help you to collect evidence. (Even if you don't want to press charges or make a report, this allows you the option in the future.)

Free Will — Remember, you have the right to decide what course of action is best for you.

Emotional Support — It can be helpful to have supports in place to help you. Some good supports might include trusted friends or family members, a counsellor or other relevant professionals. At George Brown College, a Sexual Violence Response Advisor can help you to connect with the appropriate services.
