4. Simulation Centre: We are the first college, nursing school, and simulation centre in Canada accredited by the Society for Simulation in Healthcare (SSH). This cutting-edge facility offers nearly 24,000 square feet of dedicated simulation space.

5. Orthotics & Prosthetics at Sunnybrook Hospital: Students learn how to design, fabricate and fit clients with braces and limbs to help restore mobility and body functionality.

6. WAVE Dental & Hearing Clinics: Our students provide clinical services to the public under the supervision of qualified professionals. Each year, we treat over 3,400 clients for dental and hearing needs.

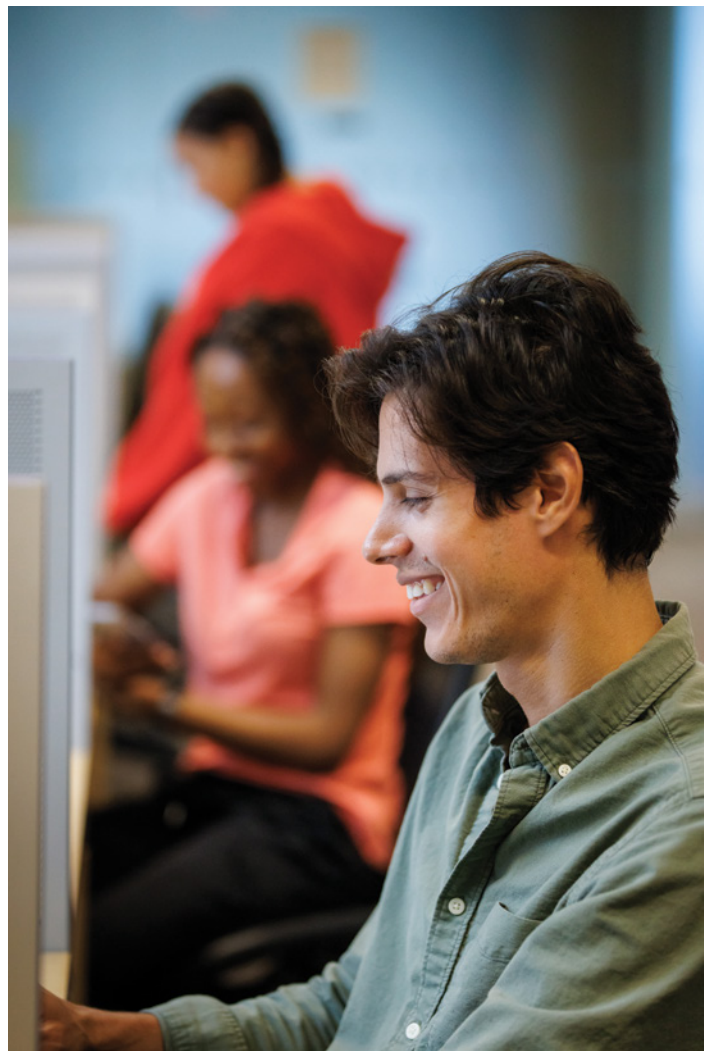


Centre for Preparatory and Liberal Studies

Fast-track programs

provide an effective way to complete a diploma program in a shorter time. At George Brown, fast-track programs take two forms: Continuous 12-month delivery and advanced standing in eligible programs if you have a post-secondary credential.



Bridging programs

allow students to build on previous education with advanced standing in one of George Brown College's honours bachelor's degree programs. Applicants with a post-secondary diploma in a related discipline may be eligible. Learn more about both fast-track and bridging options at georgebrown.ca/fast

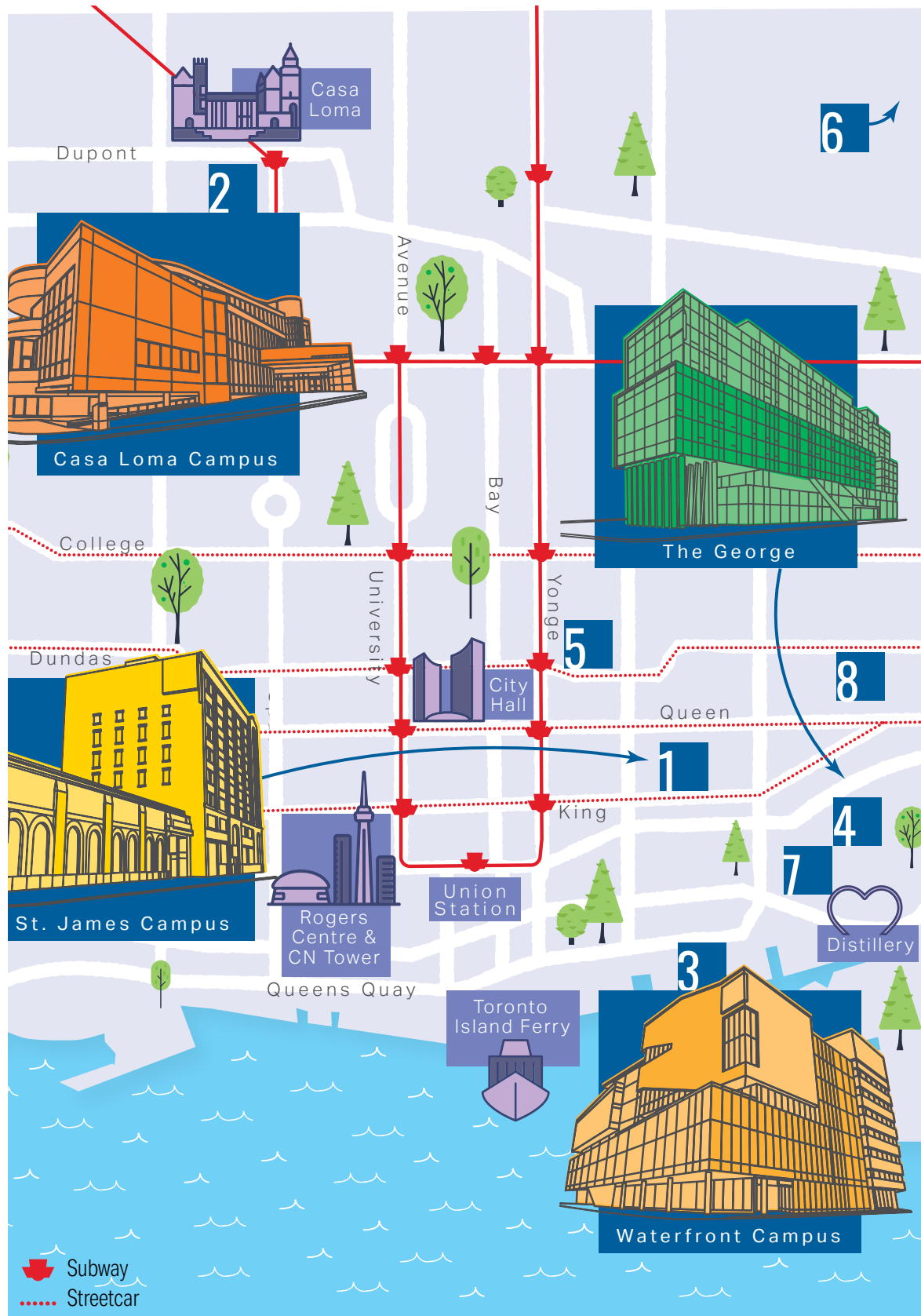
George Brown has three campuses located in downtown Toronto (Casa Loma, St. James and Waterfront) as well as The George, our student residence.

Limberlost Place: A Sustainable Learning Hub

George Brown College is excited to announce the upcoming opening of Limberlost Place, a groundbreaking 10-storey mass-timber building set to redefine sustainable learning. Part of the expansion of GBC's Waterfront campus located at Queens Quay East and Dockside Drive, this innovative space will open its doors in January 2025, serving as a new home for students, faculty, and the community.

Designed with a strong emphasis on sustainability, Limberlost Place is a net-zero building, meaning it generates the same amount of clean energy as it consumes. Constructed with locally sourced mass timber, the building prioritizes well-being through abundant natural light, fresh air, and energy-efficient systems. This forward-thinking approach will contribute to significant revisions in national and provincial building codes, paving the way for future mass-timber structures.



A New Era for Students

Limberlost Place will be a dynamic hub for learning and innovation. Students in the School of Architectural Studies will benefit from state-of-the-art facilities and collaborative spaces. The new athletics centre will provide opportunities for students to stay active and engaged, while the Indigenous space will foster cultural connection and celebration.

Brookfield Sustainability Institute (BSI)

The building will also house the Brookfield Sustainability Institute, a leading centre focused on aligning digital transformation and sustainability to benefit communities worldwide. Through partnerships with governments, businesses and non-profits, the institute will drive innovative sustainability projects and develop the next generation of sustainability leaders.

Mary's Place Child Care Centre

A very generous donation from the Jackman Foundation will allow for the creation of Mary's Place Child Care Centre within Limberlost Place. This centre will not only provide childcare services but also serve as a valuable learning environment for GBC's Early Childhood Education students.

A Community Cornerstone

Beyond its educational role, Limberlost Place will be a cornerstone of the East Bayfront community. Its sustainable design, commitment to well-being, and focus on innovation make it a model for the future.

Financial Aid

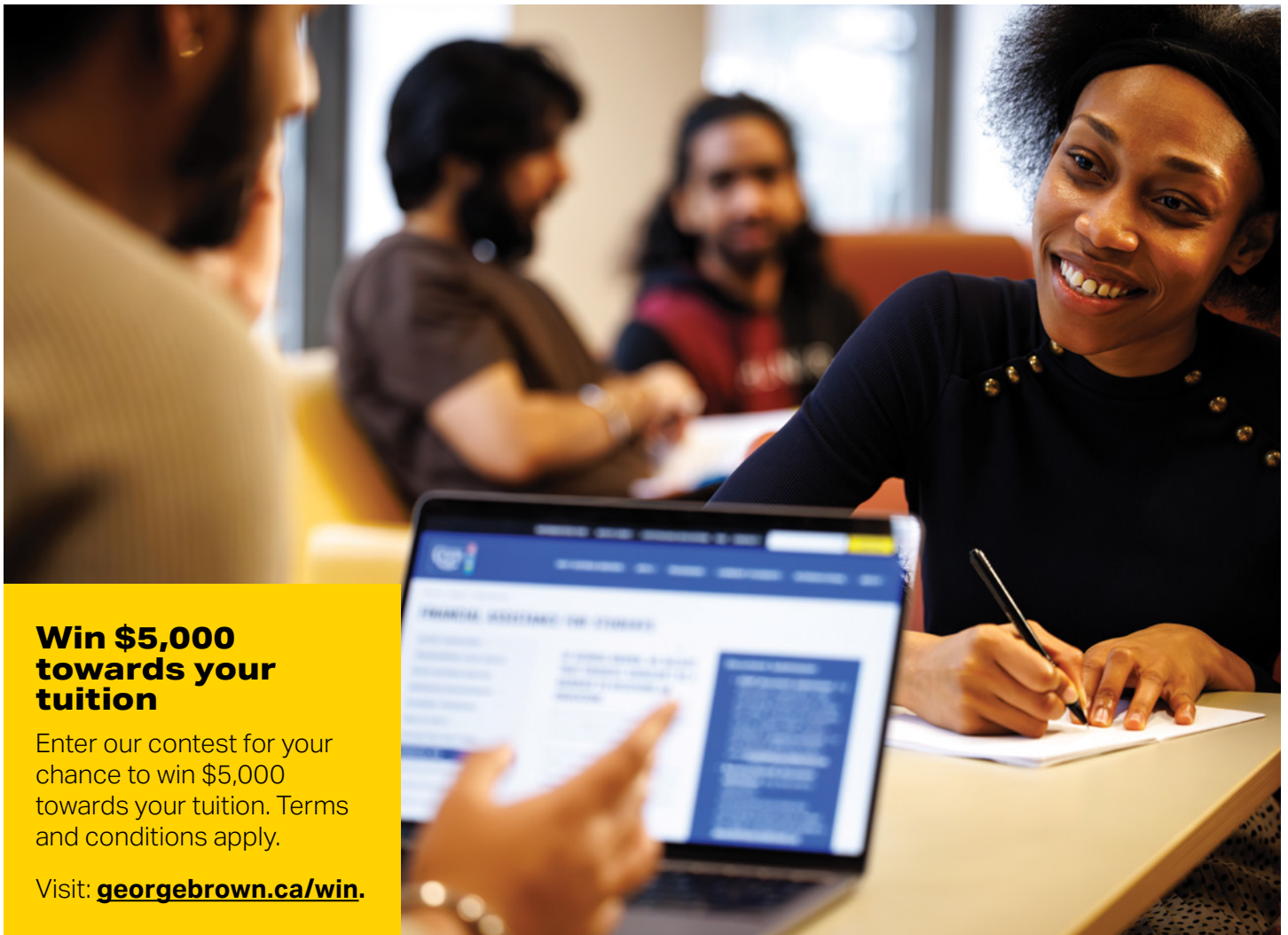
Finances shouldn't be a barrier to receiving an education. At George Brown College, we have resources that can help you pay for college, and our Financial Aid team is here to provide support.

- The Ontario Student Assistance Program (OSAP) provides assistance through loans (money you pay back) and grants (money you don't have to pay back).
- Awards, scholarships, and bursaries at George Brown recognize financial need, academic success, and community involvement. You can apply for internal awards through STU-VIEW, but external awards are also available at different times of the year.
- The Work Study Program provides eligible, full-time students with part-time work opportunities on campus. Through this program, students can work up to 15 hours a week.

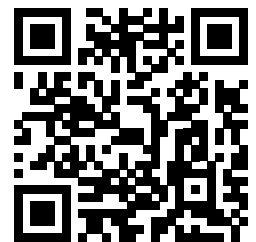
Funding for First-Year Students

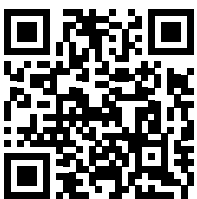
Office of Anti-Racism, Equity and Human Rights Services (OAREHRS)

How to Apply

In Ontario, domestic students apply to all colleges through **OntarioColleges.ca**. You can apply for up to five programs through one application. Most programs at George Brown are eligible for early offers, which means depending on your date of application, you may hear back as early as **November 1**. For highly competitive programs, make sure you apply by **February 1, 2025** for equal consideration for an available space.



1. Find the program that's right for you

Research programs online through our Program Finder tool. You can compare programs side by side using our Program Comparison feature.

Consider attending an upcoming open house or information session to meet faculty and staff, and have your questions answered.



2. Complete the application process at Ontario Colleges

Apply online for up to 5 programs and send in your academic documents if required. For high school applicants, grades will be transmitted electronically by your school.



3. Track your application status online

Applicants can track their application status at stuvview.georgebrown.ca.



4. Complete any additional application requirements and accept your offer

In some cases, our programs require an assessment, interview, audition or questionnaire. We will let you know if that's required for your program.



Introducing Our New Programs

George Brown College continues to innovate and expand its academic offerings to meet evolving industry demands. We are proud to introduce several new programs that equip students with the right skills and the training to be job-ready upon graduation.

Our **Honours Bachelor of Business Administration (Management)** program prepares students to assume leadership roles as management consultants, project managers, business development managers, and more. The interdisciplinary curriculum integrates core principles with contemporary management practices, providing students with a comprehensive foundation in business administration.

We have launched three new postgraduate programs in Computer Technology to meet the rapidly evolving labour market needs.

Our **Artificial Intelligence for Robotics** program prepares students to work with AI algorithms, machine learning, and robotics. This program prepares students for high-demand careers in developing intelligent autonomous systems and revolutionizing how machines interact with the world.
