- Counselling
- Safety planning

- Academic/employment accommodations
- External referrals

When receiving services from us you can be expect to be treated with dignity and respect. Always.

Discrimination

Discrimination is being treated unfairly or differently because of one's age, sex, race, citizenship, sexual orientation or any of the prohibited grounds. Discrimination can result in disadvantages, barriers to opportunities or being given preferred access to opportunities for one group over another.

Harassment

Harassment is one or a series of comments or behaviours related to one or more of the prohibited grounds. These comments should be known to be unwelcome, unwanted, offensive, intimidating, hostile or inappropriate.

What do I do if I am experiencing Discrimination or Harassment?

A Human Rights Advisor can help address the issue you are facing either formally or informally and can support you to you file a human rights complaint within the College.

Human rights complaints are complaints of discrimination or harassment on the basis of one or more of the 17 Prohibited Grounds detailed in the Ontario Human Rights Code. The procedure for resolving a complaint is outlined in the George Brown College Human Rights Discrimination and Harassment Policy.

Note: Human Rights Advisors maintain confidentiality unless they are required to reveal information to ensure the safety of community members or as required by law.
