DID YOU KNOW?

You can make Canada your home after your studies. Post-graduation work permit allows eligible students who have completed their academic program to live and work in Canada between 8 months to 3 years (depending on the length of your studies). Furthermore, work obtained through the Post-Graduation Work Permit Program may help support your application to become a permanent resident of Canada (see more on page 13).





WHAT YOU NEED TO KNOW BEFORE APPLYING

George Brown College's programs are sought-after, and seats are limited. For a better chance of securing an international seat, you will need to ensure that you have all the admission requirements ready before applying.

IN ORDER TO BE ADMITTED INTO THE PROGRAM (DIPLOMA/CERTIFICATE/POSTGRADUATE/DEGREE) OF YOUR CHOICE YOU MUST:

- Have graduated from senior secondary school or equivalent (those applying for a postgraduate program must have graduated from a university or college)
- Be 18 years of age or older at the time of registration
- Pay the non-refundable \$95 application fee
- Provide proof of English proficiency, if English is not the first language in your country

NOTE: Some programs have program-specific admission requirements.



STUDYING AND WORKING IN CANADA

Whether you want to work during your studies at George Brown or are looking to live and work in Canada after you graduate, we have resources and support to help you get there.

STUDY PERMITS

All students studying in Canada for more than six months will need a Study Permit. You must apply before arriving in Canada at the nearest Canadian Embassy, High Commission or Consulate. Learn more at the Immigration, Refugees and Citizenship Canada (IRCC) website at <https://www.canada.ca/en/immigration-refugees-citizenship/services/study-canada.html>

Students studying for six months or less while in Canada, do not require a study permit, however, they must have a valid status in Canada.

WORKING DURING YOUR STUDIES

Full-time students registered at George Brown may have the option to work up to 20 hours a week during their studies in an off-campus job or work on-campus as well. You will need a valid Study Permit with conditions printed on it to allow the permit holder to engage in on- or off-campus work and must apply for a Social Insurance Number once you arrive in Canada.

CO-OP WORK PERMITS

Work Integration learning opportunities, such as co-op placements, externships, clinicals, and field placements are an important part of many George Brown learning programs. International students in programs that have work integrated learning opportunities must apply for a Co-op Work Permit. The co-op work permit can be applied at the same time as applying for your Study Permit.

Note: Students in programs where the placements involve working in a health-care setting or working with vulnerable population (elderly or children) will require a valid IRCC medical exam at the time of applying for co-op work permit.

WORKING IN CANADA AFTER YOU GRADUATE

After graduation, many students choose to stay in Toronto and gain North American work experience. We also embed some form of hands-on experience into every Health Sciences program. Some students will practice their skills onsite in our accredited Simulation Centre and others will learn in our onsite WAVE Clinics (Wellness, Applied Research and Visionary Education) – a facility where faculty-supervised students provide dental and hearing services to members of the public. Regardless of which program you choose, you’ll have the chance to start building a professional network off-site with one of our clinical partners.






